History of the Hartford Courant To Be Dinner Topic

The Hartford Courant is the oldest continuously published newspaper in the United States – and may be the oldest in the English-speaking world. Founded in 1764 as the Connecticut Courant, it has always been published in Hartford. Its frequency – weekly, daily – and format have changed over the years, but it has outlasted all its competitors. The Courant reported the signing of the Declaration of Independence as news.

At the May 10, 2011 Court and Dinner of the Society of the Descendants of the Founders of Hartford, the 246-year history of the Courant will be the topic of a talk by Henry McNulty, longtime former writer and editor at the Courant and former Governor of the Founders of Hartford. Mr. McNulty worked for the Courant from 1969 to 1995, and now is a communication consultant in Cheshire, Conn.

The dinner will be held at the Officers' Club of Connecticut, located in the State Armory in Hartford, which coincidentally is right across the street from the Hartford Courant. Cocktails will begin at 6 p.m., with dinner at 6:45 and Mr. McNulty's talk following.

He will discuss how the Courant was sued by Thomas Jefferson for criminal libel; how the Courant helped form the Republican Party in Hartford; and how, when the newspaper's source of paper was interrupted during the Revolutionary War, the (female) publisher acquired paper. The Courant now shares its Hartford headquarters with TV Channel 61; both the paper and the station are owned by Chicago-based Tribune Company.
