Connecticut Historical Society Director to Speak

Kate Steinway, the new Executive Director of the Connecticut Historical Society and Museum, will be the speaker at the annual Court and Dinner of the Society of the Descendants of the Founders of Hartford. The dinner will be held on Thursday, May 10, at the Hartford Golf Club in West Hartford.

The title of her talk will be “Whither the Connecticut Historical Society? Challenges and Opportunities Facing the Organization – Or, What Happens When You’re Named Director and All Hell Breaks Loose.”

The title refers to the fact that the Connecticut Historical Society took over operations at Hartford’s Old State House about four years ago. Since then, the CHS has said it is unable to keep the Old State House financially afloat. The City of Hartford actually owns the 1796 building, but has cut back on its financial contribution due to reductions in federal grants.

Steinway, who lives in West Hartford, earned an M.A. in art history from the University of Chicago and has been associated with the Connecticut

Historical Society for more than 20 years. She oversees all exhibition and educational programs, and previously had been curator, department head, and exhibit designer. She was formerly the Deputy Director for Interpretation for both the Historical Society and the Old State House, and was named to the new post at the end of December 2006. Less than two months later, the financial drain on the CHS from running the Old State House led the Historical Society to announce that it would have to close the national landmark if it did not receive financial assistance.

At the event, cocktails will be served starting at 6 p.m., followed by dinner at 7:00. Steinway’s talk will follow. **Please note the new location of the court and dinner.**

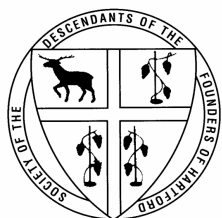


Donations Made To Organizations
