History of Oldest Newspaper To Be Dinner Topic

The Hartford Courant is the oldest continuously published newspaper in the United States. It reported the signing of the Declaration of Independence as news in 1776. But why did the Courant choose to run this story – probably the most important of the decade, if not the century – on Page 2, not on the front page?

That mystery, and others, will be explained at the May 10, 2011 Court and Dinner of the Society of the Descendants of the Founders of Hartford, where the nearly 250-year history of the Courant will be the topic of a talk by Henry McNulty, longtime former writer and editor at the Courant and former Governor of the Founders of Hartford. Mr. McNulty worked for the Courant from 1969 to 1995, and now is a communication consultant in Cheshire, Conn.

The dinner will be held at the Officers' Club of Connecticut. Cocktails will begin at 6 p.m., with dinner at 6:45 and Mr. McNulty's talk following.

He will discuss how the Courant won a case before the Supreme Court of the United States that was brought in 1806, and how that case established important new limits on the



power of the federal courts; how Mark Twain interacted with the Courant; how in 1898 the newspaper used the most advanced technology of the time to give Hartford almost-instant election results; and why the Courant is no longer the Republican Party standard-bearer in Connecticut, as it was for more than 100 years.

The Courant now shares its Hartford headquarters with TV Channel 61; both the paper and the station are owned by Chicago-based Tribune Company.

New Location for Dinner

Please note that this year, the Founders of Hartford Court and Dinner will be in the Officers Club of Connecticut, which is located in the State Armory (by coincidence, directly across the street from the Hartford Courant building).

The Armory is at 360 Broad Street, Hartford. Parking is available in the nearby garage of the Legislative Office Building. Follow signs in the Armory to get to the club.

Behind the Scenes

Much of the work of the Society of the Descendants of the Founders of Hartford goes on out of the immediate view of its members. And one of the chief "behind the scenes" people is our Genealogist, Timothy Jacobs of West Hartford.

Every prospective new member must have his or her descent from a Founder of Hartford proven. Checking all those proofs is a time-consuming and meticulous job, and Tim has been at it for years. In addition to his work for the Founders, he's also the Registrar at the Connecticut Society of the Sons of the American Revolution and the Registrar General at the Order of Founders and Patriots of America.

Insignia Available
